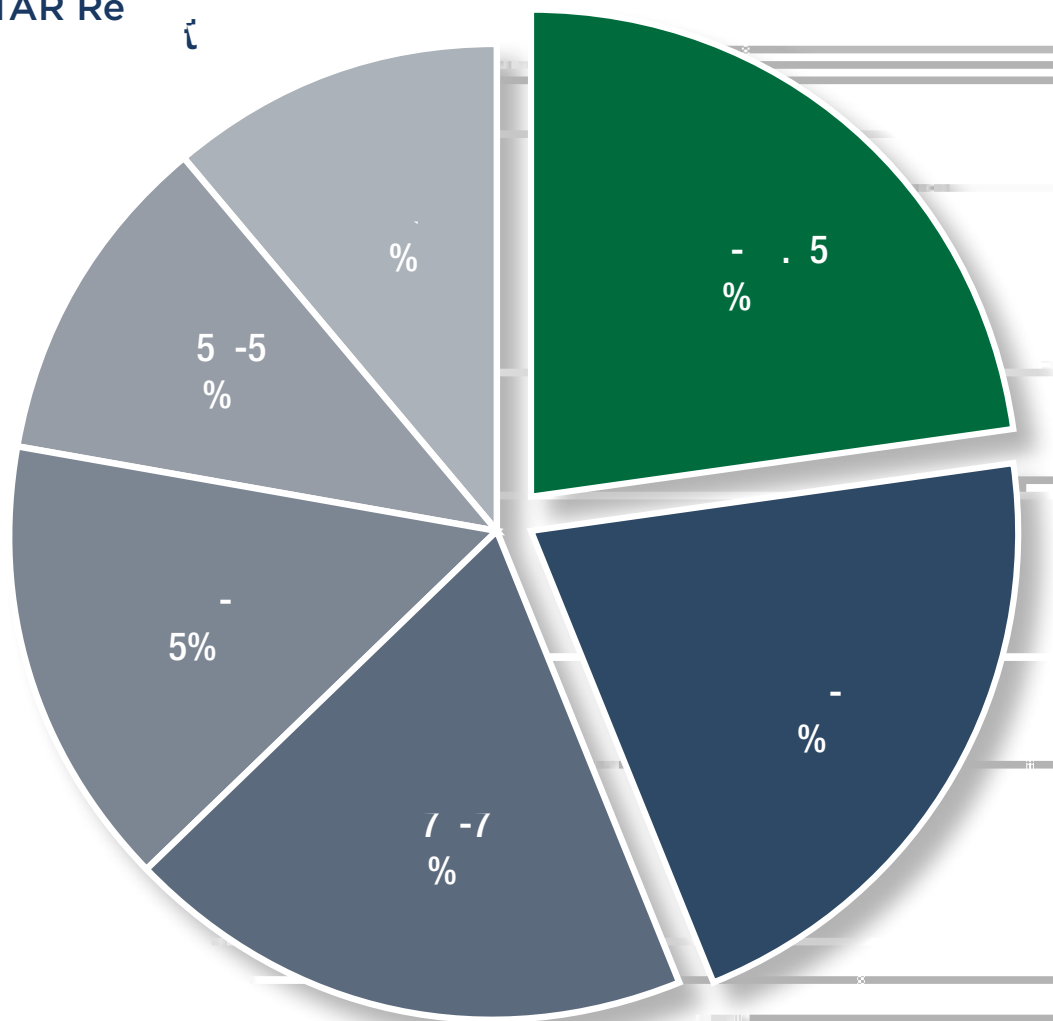
Not your average school

Case Study 2020 - Academic Performance

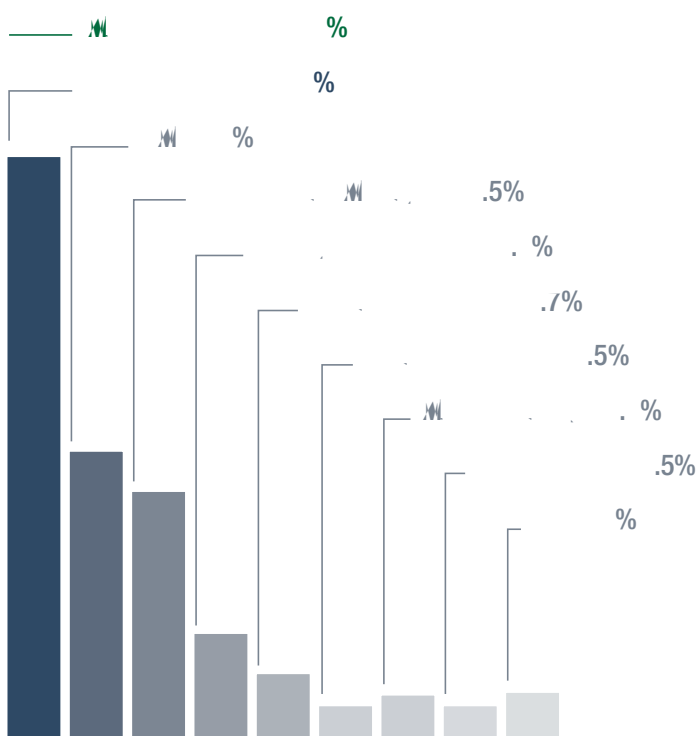
- 279 students received their VCE Certificate
- College Dux with top ATAR 99.5
- 32 students scored over 95
- The median study score was 31
- 122 students scored 80 or more (44%)
- Average ATAR Score was 73.03
- 63 students scored 90 or more
- 122 students achieved study scores over 40 (8.2% of total study scores)
